However, Snowmass also offers a wide variety of free summer activities, events, and experiences for guests and community members to enjoy.

Free Activities in Snowmass

ACES Guided Hikes – Daily, starting June 15: Aspen Center for Environmental Studies (ACES) returns to Snowmass this summer to lead twice daily hikes. The Snowmass Wildflower Walk begins at 10:00 a.m., on the Nature Trail, while the Ice Age Discovery Walk starts at 1:00 p.m. on the Discovery Trail. Hikes are led by a knowledgeable ACES environmentalist and feature history, facts, trivia, flora and fauna, and possible wildlife sightings. Hikes leave from the Snowmass Mall Ticket Pavilion. Daily through September 4; Saturdays and Sundays only in September: September 7 & 8, September 14 & 15, September 21 & 22, September 28 & 29. www.gosnowmass.com/activity/aces/

Anderson Ranch Arts Center: Founded in 1966, Anderson Ranch Arts Center is a premier destination for art making and critical dialog in the contemporary art world, bringing together aspiring and internationally renowned artists to discuss and further their work in a stimulating environment. With a campus that is free and open to the public and an extensive array of in-person and online offerings, Anderson Ranch is a hub of creative energy and activity for adults and children alike, with a host of virtual and interactive art workshops, lectures by today's most influential artists and curators, weekend classes, children's art workshops and more. www.andersonranch.org

Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center: Snowmass, along with the rest

of the Roaring Fork Valley is the first IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center™ in Colorado, as designated by the International Mountain Biking Association. The IMBA Gold-Level designation, the top award for mountain biking destinations, offers mountain bike enthusiasts more than 300 miles of high quality singletrack from Aspen and Snowmass to Basalt, Carbondale, and Glenwood Springs. Guests riding in Snowmass and the Roaring Fork Valley can take their pick of adventure, from lift-served gravity trails in the Snowmass Bike Park and expert-only long rides, to family-friendly trails and backcountry adventures. The Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center is the first Gold-Level Ride Center in Colorado, only the fifth in United States, and among only seven in the world. Hiking: Snowmass has 90+ miles of hiking trails, and 2.8 million acres of adjacent wilderness to be explored, providing accessible and scenic hiking for all abilities. Visit www.hikesnowmass.com to plan a curated hike for any ability.

Snowmass Ice Age Discovery: In 2010, a construction crew unearthed a single tusk of a mammoth while digging at Ziegler Reservoir in Snowmass Village. The Denver Museum of Nature and Science took over the site and went on to unearth 35,000 bones of large mammals and small vertebrate species. The Snowmass paleontological site is the richest Ice Age ecosystem ever found at high altitude. Explore a dedicated Ice Age Discovery website, complete with video and augmented reality experiences; new trail installations and artful exhibits on designated trails and around Snowmass; an Ice Age passport experience through the Village; Ice Age Discovery Days, and more. www.snowmassiceage.com

Snowmass Ice Age Discovery Explorer Tours - Fridays, starting June 14: Did you know Snowmass is the site of the finest ice age fossil discovery in the world? Learn the full story of this remarkable discovery from an Aspen Science Center educator. Every Friday at 3:30 p.m., meet in the Limelight Snowmass lobby to learn about the mammoths and mastodons who used to live here, and see replicas of Ice Age animal bones, teeth, tusks and more. Then, follow along on a guided Ice Age Passport Walk through Base Village and the Snowmass Mall to see art inspired by the discovery and earn an Ice Age prize! The Collective Snowmass: The Collective Snowmass, the hub for community activity in Snowmass Base Village, features a robust summer lineup of weekly programming. In addition, complimentary fitness on The Rink and Movies Under the Stars fill out the summer schedule. The Snowmass Live Comedy and Music Series returns on Friday evenings, and the highly successful winter Comedy WKND celebrates its summer debut, July 12-14. In addition, the summer schedule includes private cooking classes at Mawita with James Beard Nominee Mawa McQueen. Outside, the Collective features yard games, splash pads, fountains, and pop-up events on The Rink. Be sure to head downstairs to check out the Selfie Den and the Game Lounge, open daily, 2:00 p.m.- 8:00 p.m., \$10/person for anyone 6 years or older. Transportation: The Roaring Fork Transit Authority (RFTA) provides extensive free bus service from Snowmass to Aspen and various points throughout the valley (for a nominal fee). Snowmass also has a free local shuttle service (Snowmass Village Shuttles) to all major activity areas in Snowmass Village. Shuttles depart every 10 minutes from the shuttle terminal located just below the Snowmass Mall on Daly Lane. Ice Age Discovery Days – June 21-22: Celebrate an exciting piece of Snowmass history! In 2010, a bulldozer thumped into the tusk of a prehistoric mammoth at Ziegler Reservoir. Hundreds of scientists and local volunteers gathered in Snowmass to unearth thousands of fossils of Ice Age plants and animals, including mastodons, mammoths and giant ground sloths. This weekend celebration brings the Ice Age Discovery to life through art and science. Friday, June 21 features a scientific lecture at the Snowmass Chapel. Learn about the discoveries made at the 2010 dig from the scientists who were there and the experts who continue to study the ice age. Speakers include Dr. Ian Miller, Chief Science Officer for National Geographic, and lead paleobotanist on the 2010 dig, Dr. Gussie Maccracken, Assistant Curator of Paleobotany for Denver Museum of Nature and Science, and intern on the 2010 dig, and David Heil, president of Aspen Science Center and Emmyaward winning former host of PBS series, Newton's Apple. Saturday, August 12 is a Community Celebration in Snowmass Base Village from 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. featuring free fun for the whole family! Complete the Ice Age Passport Walk, Iearn about the discovery with education stations from Aspen Science Center, enjoy live music, kids' activities, prizes, and more.

Movies Under the Stars – June 29-August 17: Returning this summer, Movies Under the Stars continues the dusk movie tradition in Snowmass Base Village on most Saturday evenings in June, July, and August.
